

Learning the Art of Management



Twenty-one current and future nonprofit leaders attended the latest segment of the Executive Management Institute sponsored by the Alliance

for Children and Families and the Board of Child Care, and held on April 25 – 30, 2004 at the Board of Child Care Conference Center in Baltimore, Maryland.

Participants studied topics such as Social Entrepreneurship, Leadership: Perspectives in Journey, Community Centered Practice, Adapting Leadership in Diverse Organizational Settings, and Leading, Implementing and Managing Change. Two of the attendees completed the full program after completing two sessions and were awarded Certificates in Nonprofit Management by the University of Michigan.

Next year, most of the remaining attendees will have the chance to complete the program during the fourth session held May 1 – 6 at the Conference Center of the School of Social Work on the campus of the University of Michigan. They will be joined by 13 new attendees.

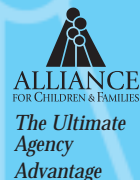
