# WHAT DOES THE IMMIGRANT CHILD'S JOURNEY LOOK LIKE?

The unaccompanied minor is placed in a regional shelter like BCC.



The Board of Child Care provides the following services through the Caminos program:

- A safe environment with staff who are trauma-informed.
- Food, clothing, and items that support the child's physical needs.
- Activities that support the child's mental health needs.
- Access to recreational activities and educational services.
- Placement with a vetted sponsor, family member, or foster parent.

After children leave BCC, they reside with a sponsor until their case is processed through immigration court.
